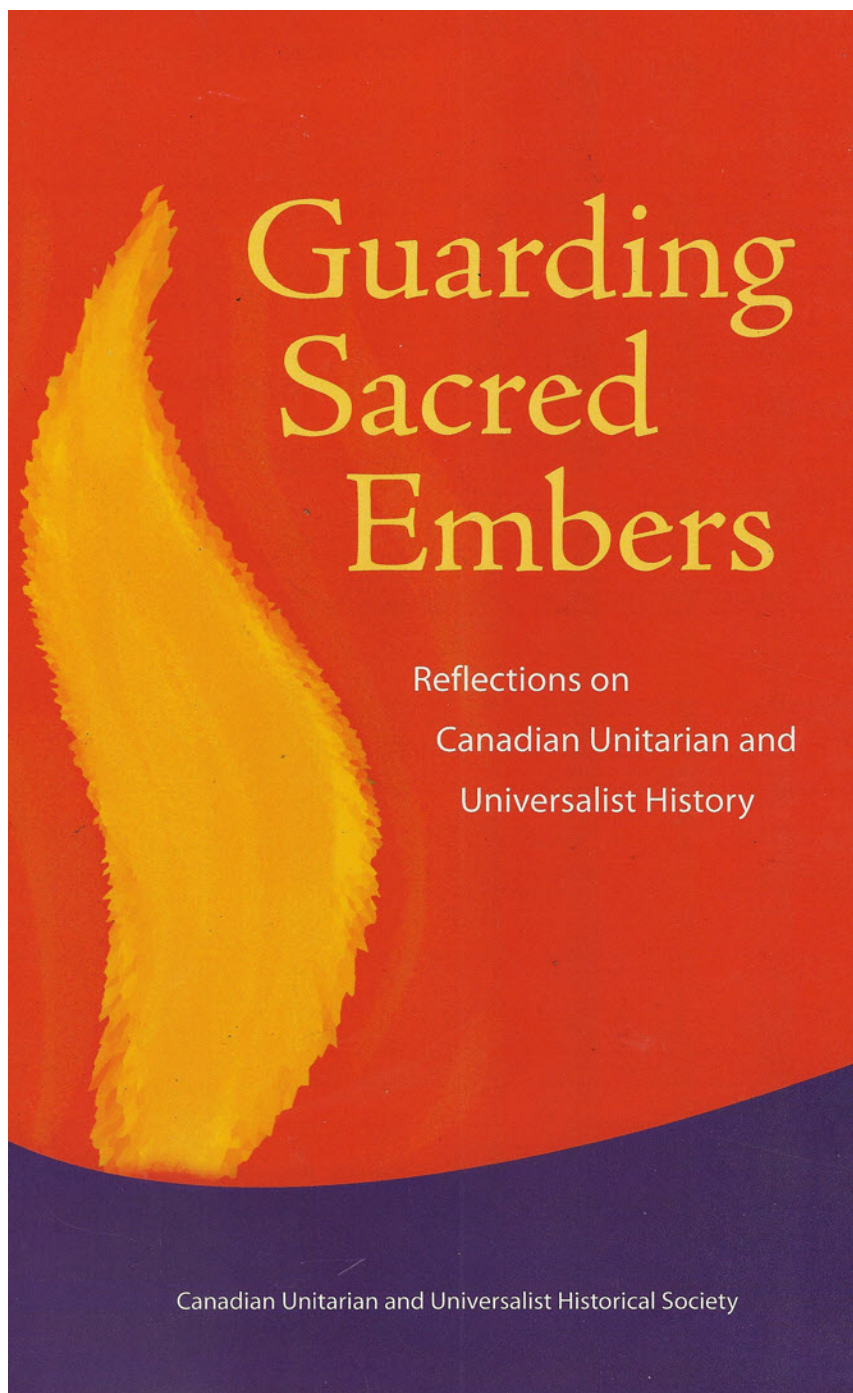


The flame of our faith may have burned in Canada for almost 200 years, but few people know the story of how it came to be established in congregations from coast to coast.

Now comes a remarkable collection of essays and excerpts which describes the growth of the Unitarian and Universalist movement in Canada, from its turbulent beginnings in the 1830s to the new challenges of the present day. Written by both lay people and ministers, the essays are published in a new book, ***Guarding Sacred Embers***, prepared by the Canadian Unitarian and Universalist Historical Society (CUUHS) to mark the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Canadian Unitarian Council (CUC).

The topics cover a broad range, including:

- Unitarian pioneers in BC, and the story of the Western Canada District
- Early women ministers in Canada
- The Irish connection
- The “Unitarian of the century”
- Icelandic Unitarianism of the Prairies
- Unitarianism and Universalism in the Eastern Townships
- First Nations involvement in our faith
- Contemporary Universalism
- The founding of the Unitarian church of Montreal
- The unique Canadian identity of our faith, including the founding of the CUC, and its 50-year history
- The international Unitarian and Universalist relationship between Canada, the USA and the rest of the world.
