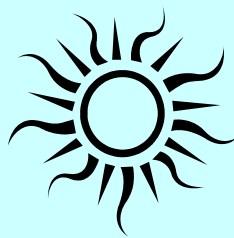

Growing Pains ...

Having had several recent epiphanies (*I love a good epiphany*), I just couldn't wait to share one with you. So ... while I will say more in September, and onward, this column is designed to ease you into the adventure.

There has been a lot of talk lately about trouble filling volunteer roles ... burnout ... restructuring ... and trying to do too much. When I use the words '**change**' or '**new building**' or – *heaven forbid* – '**growth**' ... I see some heads lower and eyes glaze over. Shoulders tense up around the listener's ears, or slump under the weight of imagined new responsibilities, tasks, expenses and details. Clearly, many of you are *feeling tired ... and a little cautious*. So let me try to set your hearts and minds at ease – by clearing up a miscommunication I think we are having.

When I think or talk about '**personal growth**' ... I can promise you that I am never – *not ever!* – thinking about '**getting bigger!**' Instead, I am generally thinking about '*getting focused*' ... '*concentrating on what matters most*' ... '*aligning my priorities*' ... and '*living more closely connected to my principles – strengthening my personal integrity.*' **Increasing in size is not the focus!** In fact, it is more likely the opposite. My hopes and plans for *personal growth* include being more selective and/or effective about my involvements, actions and decisions – and are more likely to *reduce* both my bulk and my excesses.

When I think or talk about '**Westwood growth**' ... the primary focus is on just that – **Focus!** What is it that makes Westwood the vibrant, beautiful, community driven place that it is? *What do we love?* What essential elements are at the core – the wondrous gifts that we want to preserve, to nurture and to share?

How can we **strengthen Westwood's core** – so that the congregation as a whole has the vibrant, essential strength needed to support the work, the interests and the needs of our community?

Someone recently suggested that Westwood is a little like a Manitoba Maple – spreading roots so far afield, in so many different directions, that the central trunk is experiencing stress and weakness. How many of us are also experiencing that in our personal lives – *so many responsibilities and activities and obligations* – that our basic, core, home strength is feeling stretched too thin?

When I talk about growth – *whether it is personal growth or Westwood congregational growth* – I am not talking about getting larger ... and moving ... and doing more ... and starting more committees and projects. I am talking about focusing on our *essential cores* ... making sure that our primary needs and commitments are met ... and then – only then – looking at what extras might enhance the primary structure.

As a small congregation, our practices must align with our resources. Great ideas and initiatives are only valuable if there is enthusiasm, support, and desire to carry them through. What we did once is not necessarily something we *have* to do every year – even if it was fun and suc-

cessful – unless there is solid support to make it happen. It is *perfectly ok* to let *some things go*.

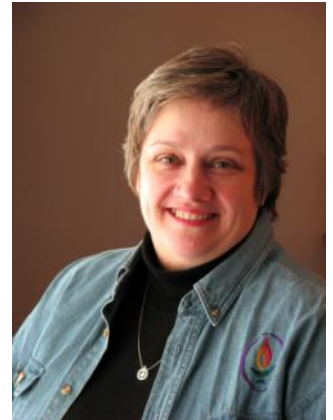
So the questions on top of *my mind* are **not** "What *more* do we need to do?" or "What kind of *building* must we have?" First – foremost – is "What is it about Westwood that people *love*?" ... "What *drew you here*?" ... "What do we need to *nurture and preserve*?" ... and "How can we – **in appropriate and healthy ways** – share these things with others?"

One message coming through loud and clear is that we need to **nurture and preserve our people** – respect *your* needs for *personal experience & exploration* – and remember *why we come here in the first place*. Very few of you came to Westwood looking – *primarily* – for a volunteer opportunity! We know that when the work overshadows everything else – *when it becomes a burden* – then the congregation ceases to be a place of *spiritual renewal* and we lose our way. Nobody wants you to stay away, *to avoid services or activities*, because there is too much pressure on volunteering – pressure that overshadows our '**essential purposes for being**'.

What is essential to Westwood? What nuggets of goodness form our core – *and what supports do these things need, to thrive?*

Spend some time pondering these two questions over the summer – so that *your unique insights and perspective* are brought to the conversation in September. As we focus on our core ... aligning our priorities with our resources and our principles ... the resulting strength and celebration will attract all manner of growth opportunities! And then ... we will **truly** be ready.

It's all a matter of perspective.

Response to my last column has ranged from "Hey, that was great Mitch, we need to hear more about taking responsibility for being a member of Westwood" to "Gee, that sounded pretty pushy. Don't you think you might scare people away?". Ah, balance. How to make people aware that there is a pretty serious need, but not demand the impossible from people. It's hard, especially given the perspective you have from being a board member.

It's been an interesting year at Westwood for me. We started the year off with a surprised new President, Kathy Lightfoot taking on Children's Religious Education, a pretty much new board, including a new treasurer, Suzanne getting her bearings in the office, and Anne entering her first full year as our settled minister. Wow. Lots of new stuff. Add to this mix a Children's Religious Education Committee doing some major rethinking of our RE programming, and a Committee on Shared Ministry working on their terms of reference and Covenant of Right Relations and we already have a busy year! Then the board saw that there was a pressing need for West-

wood to revisit it's Vision and Mission statements and embarked on a process that saw workshops and meetings and consultation and writing, and rewriting and rewriting. In the end, we ended up with a Mission Statement that we passed on to the Long range Planning Team we set up.

All of this work has lead to many discussions and gathering of information. There are many wonderful things happening at Westwood. Perhaps it would have been better for my perspective if I'd listened to my our advice and continued to look at our strengths as a congregation. It can be hard, when you are sitting on the board, not to focus on the committees without chairs and members, the talk of Volunteer burnout, the struggles of individuals to do what they feel they need to do.

Westwood has so much potential. We have a great gift to share with the world: A place of caring and acceptance. A place where you can ask questions and be heard. Where you can speak your piece. Where you can explore your spirituality with others. It can be hard to see that potential and see things not happening as quickly as you would like. (sometimes not happening at all.)



So sometimes, as a board member, you can get caught up in a perspective of poverty, not abundance. Westwood truly is a wonderful place, with many people doing great things to make Westwood, Edmonton, and even the world a better place. It's truly something to celebrate.

Yes, we have our challenges, but really, those are opportunities to explore different ways of doing the work that Westwood chooses to do. They are opportunities to learn from one another, and to find common ground with one another. Isn't that what this community is about?

I'm really looking forward to next year, as we continue to discover what this wonderful congregation is all about, and how we can all take part in its many blessings. I hope you are looking forward to next year too!

The Westwood Board of Trustees met on March 3 and completed a detailed review of the **2010/2011 budget**. After a lot of discussion and discernment, they were able to put the

finishing touches on the budget that will be presented to the congregation at our AGM on May 30.

The Committee on Shared Ministry (COSM) has now produced a **"Covenant of Right Relations" handbook**. This handbook is the result of a lot of hard work and the final product looks great. Thank you to COSM (Carl Ulrich, Elaine Roberts, Lorian Kennedy), our Minister, Anne Barker and to all the Members and Friends that contributed to this process!

Suzanne Grant has developed a comprehensive **handbook of procedures for Committee Chairs**.

The handbook is very detailed and it will serve as an excellent resource for anyone wishing to Chair or Co-Chair a committee. Thank you, Suzanne!

Suzanne Grant will also be replacing Christine Watts as the **recording Secretary for the Westwood Board**. The Board is grateful to Suzanne for stepping into this position and to Christine for her excellent work in this role over the past several

months.

The Board has approved an expense of **\$600 for improvements to our nursery** and an expense of **\$50 for Kathy Lightfoot** to become a member of the **Liberal Religious Educators Association (LREDA)**.

As this is the last newsletter before our summer break, the Board would like to **thank the many people who put in many volunteer hours and the people who supported Westwood financially** over the past year. From Committee Chairs to work bee helpers to Sunday service volunteers to participants in our Mission and Vision process, you have all helped Westwood become the magical place that it is. A Founding Father - sort of!

It seems appropriate to have Rob Brownlie's obituary in our June newsletter. After all, June was the month of the inaugural Westwood service in 1982, some 28 years ago. Rob Brownlie was the minister at the Unitarian Church of Edmonton then and it was his belief that the city of Edmonton could sustain two Unitarian churches. He proposed the idea to the members of the congregation with the idea that the second church be in St. Albert. The congregation took up the idea but after studying the city demographics decided that the second congregation should be on the south side, somewhere not too far from the University. And so the idea of Westwood was born. With 13 members and a number of people from UCE who committed to be members-on-loan, they forged ahead to move from idea to reality in a few short months. Rob died in Kelowna in March of this year and Westwood is part of his legacy.

Rev. Rob Brownlie's obituary:

Born in New York city on September 10th, 1921, Robert William Brownlie (a Purple Heart veteran of WWII) passed away of heart failure on Saturday afternoon, March 27th, 2010 at the Kelowna General Hospital with three loving friends by his side.

Rob is survived by his daughter Pat (Robert); son Peter (Deborah) and grandsons, Matthew (Ashley) and Colin (Deborah); son Andrew (Amy) and son Richard (Robin) all residing in the United States, as is the mother of his grandsons, Rev. Christine Brownlie. Rob is also survived by his devoted "rescue cat", Amy, a constant companion of more than 15 years. He was pre-deceased by his youngest son, Chris (Phill) in 1989, and by his wife Dorothy in 1971. Rob is survived by former wives, Susan Shaver, whose son Richard he adopted, and Denise Brownlie (Joan).

In recent years, Rob received much-appreciated help from Kelowna Unitarian friends, particularly Suzanne Stevenson and Laila and Elvin Isaac.

After a successful early career in business, in 1958 Rob moved his young family to Maine, where he attended theological seminary, and subsequently served Unitarian congregations in Maine, Massachusetts and Minnesota before moving to Canada during the Vietnam years. He became the minister of the Unitarian Church of Edmonton, where he led the congregation for 15 years.

Upon retirement to Kelowna, Rob became well-known as a passionate supporter of civic and cultural organizations. He collected art, especially by local artists, and regularly attended theatre, concerts and cultural events. Rob was a wine and food enthusiast and a frequent and appreciated patron of many of Kelowna's fine restaurants and wineries. Even more, Rob was the "white-haired walker" until age 87, with a daily route of 15km or more, often along the Westside Road, but recognized with a wave by motorists all around the Okanagan. He collected cans and bottles during those walks, raising surprising amounts of money over the years for Serena Sterns and her staff at the Drop-in and Information Centre, whose work he greatly admired.

An environmentalist even before the word was popular, and with a caring heart for any person or animal "down on their luck", few people knew the extent to which Rob lived his Unitarian universalist beliefs and shared everything he had. Rob's mantra: "Forgive. Love. Give." What a tribute it would be to Rob, and a comfort to this family and friends if anyone who is prompted to do so reaches out as he did with a "random act of kindness" - whether to the earth, to a person in need or to the SPCA.

By Rob's wish, there will be no formal service.

How long does it take you to get to Westwood on a Sunday morning? Between 10-15 minutes

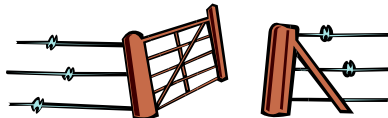
What is your favourite meal? I really enjoy Thai food, especially tom ka gai (coconut chicken soup)
